FIRST STANZA

I am (2 special characteristics you have)
I wonder (something of curiosity)
I hear (an imaginary sound)
I see (an imaginary sight)
I want (an actual desire)
I am (the first line of the poem repeated)
Example

I am polite and loud I wonder about my grandson's future I hear a unicorn's cry I see Atlantis I want to have more grandchildren I am polite and loud



<u>SECOND STANZA</u>

I pretend (something you actually pretend to do) I feel (a feeling about something imaginary) I touch (an imaginary touch) I worry (something that bothers you) I cry (something that makes you sad) I am (the first line of the poem repeated) Example I pretend I am a singer I feel an angel's wings I touch a summer's cloud I worry about Brexit I cry when I see children in pain I am polite and loud



<u>THIRD STANZA</u>

I understand (something that is true) I say (something you believe in) I dream (something you dream about) I try (something you really make an effort about) I hope (something you actually hope for) I am (the first line of the poem repeated) Example I understand your love for me I say children are our future I dream for a time in Lisbon I try to do my best I hope for a healthy retirement I am polite and loud.
