# Singular Possessive Pronouns

- A <u>possessive pronoun</u> takes the place of a possessive noun.
- A **possessive pronoun** shows who or what owns something.

• My, your, his, and her are singular possessive nouns.

### Plural Possessive Pronouns

• A <u>plural possessive pronoun</u> shows who or what owns something.

• Its, our, your, and their are plural possessive pronouns.

### Possessive Pronouns

- Singular Possessive
- shows ownership of one person
- my
- your
- her
- his

- Plural Possessive
- shows ownership of more than one person
- its
- our
- your
- their

### Possessive Nouns

- John and Jan's house is brick.
- Anndrea's house is brick.
- The dog's bone is lost.
- Hank's leg is broken.
- Trinna's car is locked.
- Chad's dad and my dad are friends.
