The most famous school in Britain is Eton College, but it is not an ordinary school. Parents must pay nearly £20,000 each year. Old students of Eton College include 21 kings and princes. There are also many scientists, writers, sportsmen, artists and politicians.

Eton College started in 1440, more than 500 years ago. It is a school for about 1,300 boys from 13 to 18 years old. Eton is a boarding school so the boys live, eat, work and sleep at the school. About 50 boys live in each 'house' but their lessons are in the main school.

The boys wake up at 7.30 every morning and then they have breakfast. They go to the chapel (a small church) at 8.40 and lessons begin at 9.00. There are five lessons in the morning. The boys have lunch at 13.30. In the afternoon, there are sports and other activities.

In the evening the boys do their homework and have supper. At 21.30, it's 'lights out'



and all the boys must go to sleep. Every day is the same. The boys have lessons every day except Sunday. Eton is a very good school because it has expert teachers, small classes and good facilities for lessons and sports.

Craig David: from DJ to Superstar

At the age of 18, Craig David became the youngest British artist to have a number one single. *Fill Me In*, his first record, was followed by *7 Days*, which became a success in 20 different countries.

Craig David was born in Southampton, a seaport on the south coast of England, on 5th May, 1981. He grew up listening to the music of Stevie Wonder, Terence Trent D'Arby and Michael Jackson.
