#### Tenses are moved into the past.



Direct Speech	Reported Speech
Present Simple	Past Simple
Present Continuous	Past Continuous
Past Simple	Past Perfect
Present Perfect	Past Perfect
Am / is / are going to	Was / were going to
Must	Had to
Will	Would

\* Modal Verbs (could, should, would and might ) do not change

Direct Speech	Reported Speech
I am ill	She said she <b>was</b> ill.
They are studying Maths	She said they were studying Maths.
She <b>phoned</b> me yesterday.	She said that she <b>had phoned</b> the day before.
Simon has come back from Paris.	He said that Simon had come back from Paris.
He <b>is going to prepare</b> dinner.	She said that he was going to prepare dinner.
You <b>must finish</b> before 9.	He said that I had to finish before 9.
I will bring you a blanket.	He said he <b>would bring</b> me a blanket.

The most common reporting verbs are say, tell and ask.

However, there are many others that can help us be <u>more precise</u> in the information we want to report.

#### Reporting Verb + To Infinitive.

AgreeAskHopeOfferPromiseRefuse

I will send you an email

I **PROMISED TO SEND** him an email.

Can I see Mary? He <u>ASKED TO SEE</u> Mary.

Reporting Verb + Object + To Infinitive.

Advise Ask Invite Promise Tell Warn

Do you want to go with me?

She **INVITED ME TO GO** with her?

I think you should'nt go. I <u>WARNED HIM NOT TO GO</u>.

#### Reporting Verb + (that) Clause.

AgreeExplain ComplainHopePoint outPromiseReplySaySuggestWarnSuggestWarn

It is too salty!

She **<u>COMPLAINED (that)IT WAS</u>** too salty.

I want to talk to you.

She **SAID (that) SHE WANTED** to talk to me.

Reporting Verb + Object + (that) Clause.

Promise Remind Tell Warn

Don't forget to buy the drinks!

She **REMINDED ME (that) I HAD TO BUY** the drinks.

I want to talk to you.

She **SAID (that) SHE WANTED** to talk to me.

#### 💐 Suggest + -ING.

We could invite Sarah for supper.

Mum **<u>SUGGESTED INVITING</u>** inviting Sarah for supper.

I'll pay you the money tomorrow
