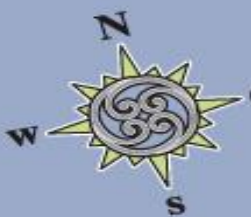

Each country in Britain has its own patron saint and floral emblem

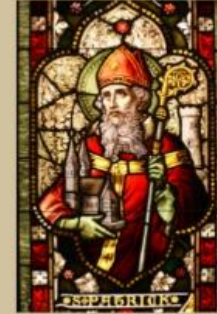


Saint David



is the patron saint of Wales.

Saint Patrick



is the patron saint of Ireland along with Saints Brigid and Columba.

Saint George



Saint George is the patron saint of England.

St Andrew



Saint Andrew is the patron saint of Scotland.
St Andrew's Day, the 30 November, is the national day with the St. Andrew's Day Bank Holiday (Scotland) Act 2007, designating the day to be an official bank holiday.



The Tudor rose is the national floral emblem of England. It symbolizes the end of the Wars of the Roses.

Thistle is a prickly-leaved purple flower which was first used in the 15th century as a symbol of defence. The thistle has been a Scottish symbol for more than 500 years. It was found on ancient coins and coats of arms.



Wales

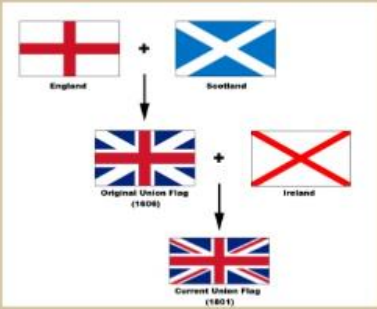
The national flower of Wales is the daffodil, which is traditionally worn on St. David's Day.

National Animal of England – The Lion



One of the great bronze lions at the base of Nelson's Column in London's Trafalgar Square

Because the lion is symbolic of bravery, it was frequently used to depict the courageous warriors of medieval England. Today, it remains the national animal of the country and is used extensively in sports' team names, logos, icons, and so on.
