## GRAMMAR: past simple irregular verbs

There are two kinds of verbs in the past simple.
Regular verbs end in -ed in the affirmative form of the past simple.

Irregular verbs have a different form in the past simple affirmative.

\text { see-saw } & \text { have-had }
\end{array}
$$

The rules for questions and negatives are the same for regular and irregular past simple verbs.
