GRAMMAR Countable & uncountable nouns

Nouns can be countable or uncountable.

Countable nouns

- have a plural form
 This dish has five eggs.
- use a/an or the for the singular Can I have an orange?
- use some with plural nouns in affirmative sentences
 I'd like some carrots.
- use any with plural nouns in negatives/questionsDoes it have any chocolate in it?
- in the dictionary, countable nouns are marked with a C pen (n/C)

Uncountable nouns

- do not have a plural form, they are always singular
 I love fruit.
- do not use a/an
- use *some* with uncountable nouns in affirmative sentences

 She drank some water.
- use *any* with uncountable nouns in negatives/questions

 Don't eat *any* bread.
- in the dictionary, uncountable nouns are marked with a U salt (n/U)

Some nouns can be countable or uncountable, but they mean different things. juice(U) = the drink a juice(C) = a glass or bottle of juice Other nouns like this are coffee, beer.

How much/how many

Use how much and how many to ask about quantities.

How much + uncountable nouns

How much rice do people eat?

How many + plural countable nouns

How many countries make rice?

Use words like *lots*, *much*, *some* to talk about quantities.

These words go before the noun.

a lot (of)/lots (of)

some

not much (with uncountable nouns) not many (with countable nouns)

He has **lots of** friends.

They don't make much money.

Too

Too + adjective means 'more than we want'.

It's too spicy.

Too + adjective and

very + adjective are different.

The tea was **too** hot. I couldn't drink it.

The tea was **very** hot, but I could drink it.
