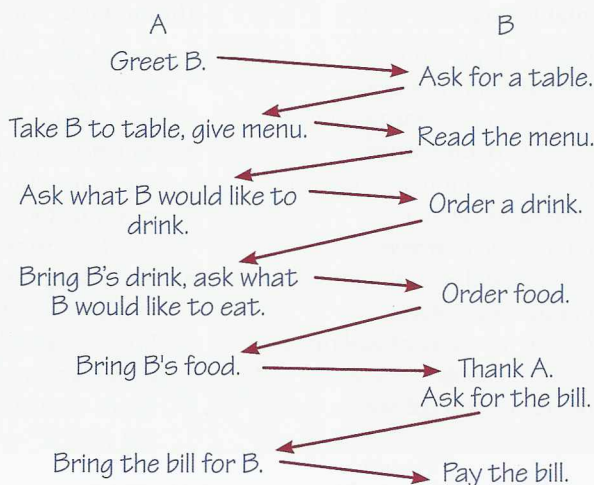

Restaurants by numbers – in the US

Eating out in the US is a big business. According to the National Restaurant association, American restaurants sell \$1.7 billion of food and drink every day.

88% of Americans say they enjoy going to restaurants.

71% of Americans say they try to eat more healthy food at restaurants now than in the past.

43% of Americans say that restaurants are an essential (very important) part of their life.

Restaurants in the US give jobs to 12.8 million people, more than any other industry in the private sector.

1 out of 4 Americans got their first work experience in a restaurant.
