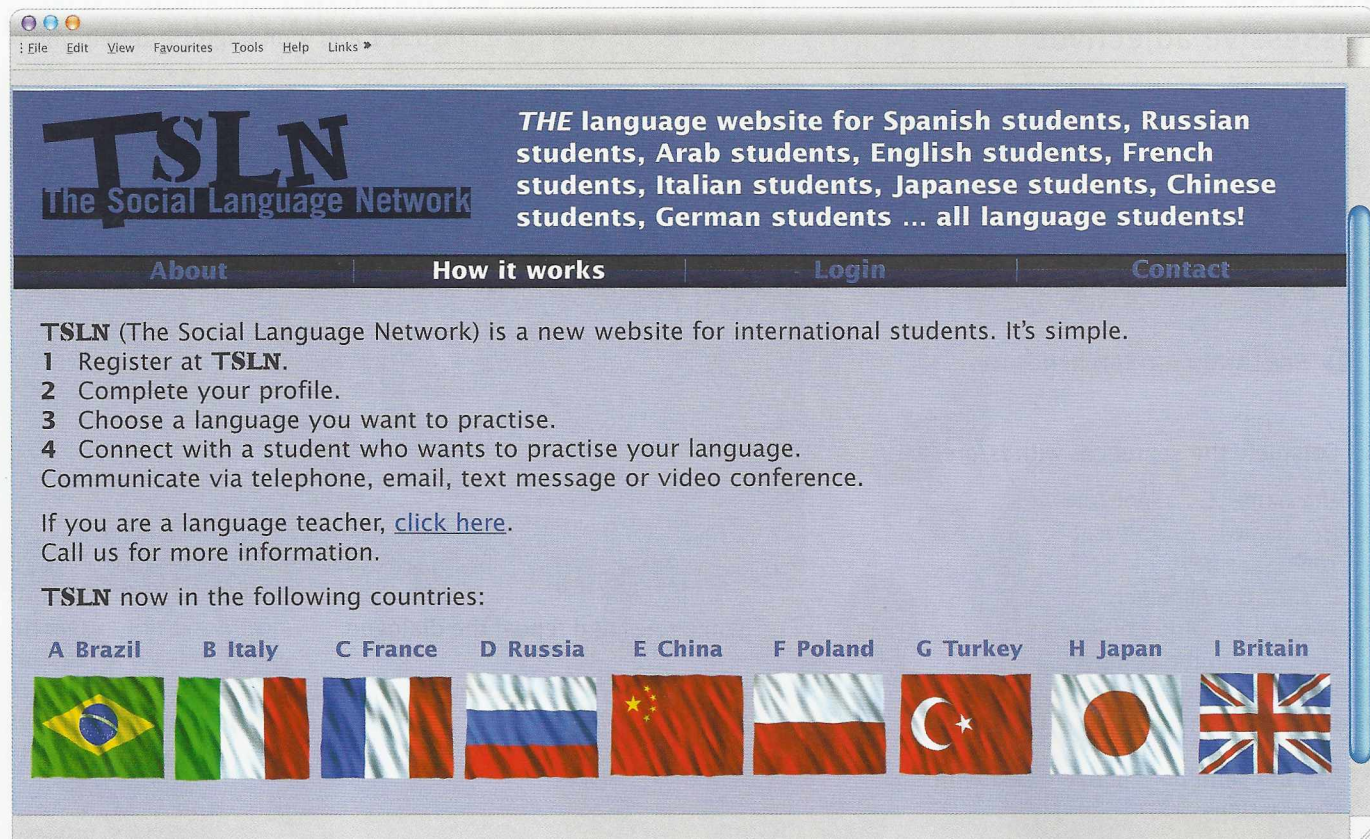

In English, there are two kinds of questions:

Wh- questions = questions with a question word

Where are you from?

Yes/no questions = questions with no question word

Are you a student?

Yes/no questions have a short answer.

Yes, I am. No, I'm not.
