


#### 1. History


- Chinese colonisation (about 10 centuries)

- The war between Vietnam and US (1964-1975)
- After 30.04.1975: Independent country

- a single-party state
- The President of Vietnam: the titular head of state
- The Prime Minister of Vietnam: the head government
- Election: every five years






#### 3. Ethnic and Religions

- A multi-ethnic country with 54 ethnic groups
- About 6 religions

#### **GEOGRAPHY**



- 8 regions, 64 provinces
- 2 main deltas: Red River Delta and Mekong River Delta
- The highest mountain:
   Phanxipang (3,143 m); a low-level plain no more than 3 meters above sea level at any point
- Mountains: accounting 40% of the country's land area; and tropical forests: covering around 42%
- The Vietnamese climate: varying considerably from place to place because of differences in latitude


#### CLIMATE

- Varying from the sub-tropics in the North to the tropics in the South depending on elevation and type of landscape.
- The humidity is high, with average ranging around 84% a year.
- The average precipitation: 1500 2000 mm/year
- The average temperature: 22 27°C




#### CLIMATE

- A tropical monsoon type of climate;
- From May-Sep the south monsoon → south to southeasterly winds.
- From Oct-April, the north monsoon with northerly to northeasterly winds affecting the country.
- The monsoon winds blowing from the northeast along the China coast and across the Gulf of Tonkin, picking up considerable moisture






Southern: 2 seasonsDry season (Dec-Apr)Rainy season (May-Nov)


